The New Lyke Wake Walk Club AGM 23/03/2024: Rachel MacAleese Doctorate of Dolefulness Presentation




Stage 1, Starting in the dark under the stars at Osmotherley and the LWW stone




Stage 2, Sunrise over the Wainstones, you have to have something beautiful to make getting up at 2:30 am worthwhile




Stage 3 To Ralph Cross complete with Boot and Bobble Hat. Again, not to scale Ralph Cross is not 10X bigger than The Wainstones.



Fat Betty , obviously windy up there the Bobble Hats have blown off




Stage 4 Passing the Blue Man of the Moor , well after all it is cold up there!
